We have the great privilege to be God's ambassadors, through whom He makes His appeal (2 Corinthians 5:20). God says of those who share His Gospel with those who don't know: "How beautiful are the feet of those who bring Good News" (Isaiah 52:7, Romans 10:15)!

If they answered the above question and seem to be giving some time, maybe ask, "Has anyone ever shared with you the 3 circles Gospel before?....It only takes a few minutes.

May I show you?" If they don't offer much time, ask: "May I have just 15 seconds of your time to share with you my story?"
